## Chronology

- **2005**: IWF-NM members Pat French, Beverly Duran, and Alexis Girard spearhead project to fund installation of historic markers that feature the contributions of the women of New Mexico to the state's history.
- 2006: Legislature passes and Governor signs HTRC HB622 which appropriated \$330,000 of capital outlay funds to the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) for expenditure in 2006-2010 to purchase and install historical markers for the New Mexico Women's Historical Marker Initiative throughout New Mexico.
- 2006-2010: The IWF-NM worked with several state agencies including the NMDOT, the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs, and the Historic Preservation Division, Cultural Properties Review Committee (CPRC), as well as representative from counties, historic and women's organizations and pueblos, tribes and the Navajo nation to:
  - coordinate with the selection committee and identify women suitable for the markers;
  - research nominees and prepare nominations:

• conduct outreach and assist in planning and dedicating the selected markers. While the appropriation contemplated the placement of only 54 markers, careful management of funds and support by the secretary of NMDOT resulted in a total of 64 markers approved during this time period. There are markers in every one of the 33 counties and include women from our pueblos tribes and the Navajo Nation.

- **2011:** House Memorial 29 and Senate Memorial 34 were passed to celebrate the completion of the Initiative and requesting that these historic women be part of the Centennial Celebration.
- **2012-PRESENT:** IWF-NM continued to submit nominees to the CPRC using its funds for research and nomination preparation. The NMDOT provided funding for the construction and placement of the additional markers. To date, there are now almost 100 markers throughout New Mexico that celebrate the outstanding women of our state.
- **2014-PRESENT:** IWF-NM began development of a website to share additional history and background about those honored on the markers. The website is found at **www.nmhistoricwomen.org**. Additional material and photos are being sought and the intent is to have the site suitable for outreach to schools and others.
